Today marks a return to premier ranks after two seasons in the wilderness and perhaps finally brings closure to the trauma of 2012, when we finished dead motherless last, and then digested the bizarre paradox of seeing no less than three of our former players from that disastrous season blossom into All White squad members - while we remained bogged down with the not insignificant challenge of repairing the damage to our first team status.

Funny old game.

But at least we can now dispassionately reflect on the equally curious 2014 season, in which the only time all year that Melville commanded a promotion berth was at the final whistle of our final match.

I'm not sure that has ever happened before. They've made Hollywood movies out of less, and we endured more twists than Gone Girl (which was very good, incidentally).

The lesson: it's never over till it's over. We suffered more losses than Solid Energy in the first part of 2014, but still got home.

It may be timely to observe Melville are traditionally slow starters, but we can't be expecting the Houdini factor every year, and it would be nice to snare a win first-up this winter rather than waiting five weeks.

This is also a big year for Melville on other fronts, with planning work having begun - under the oversight of committee member Mark Watson - on development of a new clubrooms complex to do justice to our flash new No 1 pitch. This will be arguably the biggest challenge the club has faced.

And speaking of the No 1 pitch, after out home game on Easter Monday we will be prevented from using it because of Fifa U-20 requirements until after the tournament quarterfinals on June 14. In the interim home matches will be played on the No 2 pitch. **Bruce Holloway.**

Down Memory Lane: 1995

It's 20 years ago this season that Melville won the northern premier league for the first time, finishing 5 points clear of Metro, with a record of 17 wins. 2 draws and 3 losses.

It was a remarkable achievement for a club that had been in the northern league third divison 5 years earlier, though at the time Melville were always considered a firm title prospect because of the number of players they had with national league experience, and the fact they'd won the Cambridge

Toruament for the third successive year.

Todav we still have a few relics from the 1995 teams hanging around the club. Steve Williams was well ensconced as coach even then. Neil Mouncher was a fearsome goalkeeper, Graham Jones and Sigi Kerbers were nuggetty midfielders, and Paul Marflitt got game time. And Wayne Barton even came back from a long-term convalesence to cameo with a few appearances and goals.

Of the others, Greg Larsen was captain, Gordon-Jon Thompson was the main attacking weapon, while other key players were Darryl Ward, Andrew McAlister, import Martin Emmett, Matt Perry, Dominic Rogerson, Ronnie Kardas, Jason Stone, Richard Kardas, Nigel Morgan and Paul Thompson.

If we look back on the premier league

landscape then, compared to today it's interesting to note half the teams of 1995 today trade under different handles (including Melville, who are now Melville United, recognising a 1996 amalgamation with Waikato United). Elsehwere Lynndale merged with Avondale United (Div 1) to form Lynn-Avon, near neighbours Pakuranga Town and Howick amalgamated to form Fencibles United, Blockhouse Bay joined with Green Bay Titirangi (Div 2 at the time) to form Bay Olympic, and Eden linked with Mt Roskill (Div 2) to form

Three Kings.

on the narrative of the season through newspaper reports. As Melville closed in on the title, coach Williams took the unusual step of publicly expressing frustration with the "a disjointed team".

"They are all reasonable players, but too many believe they have superstar status," he said ahead of the home top of

the table match against Metro on July 21. "The 'want' factor which can be critical in winning is not always there."

Williams professed that he far preferred old fashioned players with heart, attitude and character rather than his squad of Generation Xers, whom he described as "gym specimens and some of the bestlooking barmen in town".

"I do wonder what motivates some of

my players. The big thing in their lives seems to be looking good and attracting airls."

Melville duly beat Metro 2-0, to end that club's 47-match unbeaten run and ultimately secured the title with a 2-1 away win over Eden, surging to an unbeatable 7-point lead.

After that victory Williams said his football philosophy was based on reproducing the same recipe that worked in business anid personal relationships.

"It comes down to careful planning and

putting the effort in. Do the basics, the preparation, and add whatever is necessary week by week"

And he described football as a thinking man's game.

"Most footballers are intelligent people. I have university students, accountants, successful businessmen in my team.

"The days of the old Fallon-type approach of smashing windows to motive players are gone. I try to address players' intelligence."
